I also asked her to keep a safe gap when following vehicles. Mary is a cautious and courteous driver.

Improvements observed:

I gave Mary some pointers to work on: Judgements at junctions If you could walk across the vehicle, then thats a safe gap to turn into the new road. If you say you will jog across, then hold back, as that is not a safe judgement at the junction. Judgments at meeting situations Read the road early and then make the decision to move ahead (LADA). Look, assess, decide, and act if in doubt, leave it out. If you see a bigger vehicle approaching, you then hold back and move when you feel it is safe to drive through. Safe gap T.O.T - When stopping behind vehicles, try to stop so you can see the tyres on tarmac rule this is a safe gap between you and the vehicle ahead of you just in case someone hits you from behind. You will not shunt onto the vehicle ahead of You. Confidence Over the 2 sessions, Mary has felt much more confident driving around. Mary made positive changes to the pointers I gave her, and I feel the more she drives, the more confident she will be. Wishing Mary the very best.

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
